FROM THE BENCH

Good afternoon and welcome to the Kal Group Stadium for today's Isuzu FA Trophy Third Round Qualifying game against Guiseley AFC. A very warm welcome to all those associated with the club - enjoy the game and have a safe return journey.

What a game on Tuesday night against Matlock
Town in The Pitching In Northern Premier League
– an eight goal thriller that hopefully everyone
enjoyed! There were however a few nervous
moments when Matlock scored two goals in
relatively quick succession to go 5-3, but our group
held firm to see the game out. I was really pleased
with the way we dealt with that final 30 minutes.

We came out of the traps flying with Javelle Clarke scoring an excellent opening goal on six minutes. He showed calmness and quality to round the goalkeeper and slot home the first goal from a tight angle after a through ball from Bobby Johnson.

It was then great to see Ashley Jackson get his first goal for the club since joining us from Scarborough. A superb delivery from Bobby Johnson was followed by a terrific header from Ash to put us 2-0 up on 13 minutes. Just four minutes later we scored again to make it 3-0, with another Bobby corner superbly headed home by Dylan Cogill to get his second goal in the last two home games.

We then needed to manage the following period a little better as we allowed Matlock back into the game with a penalty that looked a little harsh, to make it 3-1. We spoke at half time about a few things... as we knew Matlock had nothing to lose. We then scored a fourth on 52 minutes, with Bobby getting his fourth assist of the game. Again a pin-point ball was met full on by centre half Hamish Douglas who powered it in with a header from ten yards out, to score his first goal for Gainsborough Trinity.

Five minutes later Declan Howe also scored his first of hopefully many goals for the club. His hard work and endeavour were rewarded as he closed the goalkeeper down, nicked the ball off him and stroked it into the net.

Another big positive from the game was the debut of goalkeeper Luke Jackson who arrived on the night on loan from Sheffield Wednesday. To say he only met the team 90 minutes before the game I thought he acquitted himself very well throughout the game, and we welcome him to Gainsborough Trinity.

Our game management could have been a little better but you have to give Matlock credit as they never gave up on the game and scored two more goals to make it a bit of a nervy ending, but over the 90 minutes we were worthy winners of the three points.

What is really pleasing is that I can see the squad getting stronger physically and mentally which puts us in a good place moving forward.

Today's game will undoubtedly be a very tough match, but we will give everything to get through to the next stage of the special FA Trophy. Bobby Johnson, Lewis Butroid and I know how special the FA Trophy is after we reached the Quarter Finals last season with Farsley Celtic, being the lowest ranked team remaining in the competition.

Unfortunately, we lost away at Gateshead on penalties after we drew 0-0 at full time, and I feel being the better team. We created very special memories for all involved and I hope we can do that again today for Gainsborough Trinity. Thank you for your outstanding support on Tuesday night; please get right behind the lads again this afternoon.

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

ood afternoon everyone and welcome to the famous old Northolme for today's FA Trophy 3rd Qualifying round match against Guiseley FC.

The FA Trophy is the flagship cup competition for Non-League clubs, and as such represents the best chance of a Wembley appearance, alongside the FA Vase.

Steve Housham's Gainsborough Trinity came agonisingly close to Wembley in the 2012-13 season, losing out to Wrexham in a 2 legged semi-final by an aggregate score of 4-3.

A fantastic crowd of 3,307 probably witnessed the greatest FA Trophy ever played on the Northolme, a 2-1 home win just not quite enough in the end.

Had the Blues won through, we would have met our fellow Lincolnshire club Grimsby Town in the Final. However, it was not to be for us, and as it turned out, for Grimsby either, as Wrexham won 4-1 on penalties after extra time.

To be fair, the FA Trophy is a competition that the Blues never seem to progress far in, for whatever reason, but after saying that, the Competition has never seen a


The first time the two clubs met each other was in the 1994-95 season in the Northern Premier League after Guiseley won the First division the season before.

35 YEARS AGO. 1988, 24th Sept- FA Trophy 1QR. Trinity 1 v Halesowen 0.

In the 20th season of the FA Trophy, Trinity welcomed Halesowen from the Banks Brewery league. September was a bad month for Trinity (6 matches without a win), manager Ernie Oliver was hoping for a change in fortunes. The win over Halesowen took the Blues to Leicester United in the 2nd qualifying round where, after a 0-0 draw away - It was a 2-4 defeat on the Northolme in the replay and a Trophy exit.



GUISELEY CLUB HISTORY

uiseley AFC was founded in 1909 by a local group of enthusiasts and the club's first success came in 1913 when they won the local Wharfedale League.

Following the end of the First World War the club switched to the Leeds League achieving little success until 1924 when another switch to the West Riding County Amateur League eventually brought them trophies.

A treble of league championships in the 1930s was aligned to two appearances in the last 16 of the old FA Amateur Cup, against South Bank in 1932 and Cambridge Town (now City) in 1934.

Another league title was gained in 1939 after which 17 years were to elapse before the fifth title was achieved in 1956.

This marked another switch to the West Yorkshire League, which heralded a remarkable run of success in the local Wharfedale Challenge Cup, winning the trophy on nine out of ten occasions played during the 1960s.

Higher status was gained in 1968 with club entering the Yorkshire League and after moderate success the Second Division the title was won in 1976.

Promotion to the First Division followed with a runners-up position being achieved in 1980 along with a League Cup success over champions Emley

Success was also achieved in the West Riding County Cup with a hat-trick of trophy wins in1979/80/81.

The year 1981 also saw the club have its first taste of FA Vase success reaching the quarter-finals before losing at home to eventual finalists Willenhall Town.

Following the set-up of the pyramid system in nonleague football in 1982, the Yorkshire League merged with the Midland League to form the Northern Counties East League with Guiseley being placed in the Premier Division at its inception.

Moderate progress was again made with third place being achieved in 1985 and again in 1986. Off the field the installation of floodlights in 1988 enabled the club to set its sights on achieving higher status.

The 1989/90 season proved to be the springboard for a very successful period for the club, with the signing of the former England international Frank Worthington plus a first FA Vase semi-fiinal appearance.

Defeat against rivals Bridlington Town was soon

forgotten as the following season saw the club go one better by not only reaching the famous Wembley Twin Towers but also featuring in a never to be forgotten 4-4 draw with Gresley Rovers.



Eventually the trophy was won three days later with a 3-1 win in the re-play at Sheffield United's Bramall Lane ground.

Further success was also achieved that season with a league and cup double together with promotion to the Northern Premier League.

Another milestone in the club's history was reached in 1991 with the First Round Proper of the FA Cup being reached for the first time.

Guiseley lost 1-0 to Chester City who were staging the game at their temporary home Macclesfield.

A further visit to Wembley in the FA Vase sadly saw the trophy relinquished to Dorset side Wimborne Town in another eight goal epic, losing 5-3.

Good progress was made in the NPL with fourth place being achieved in the first two campaigns together with the First Division Cup being lifted in 1993. Under the guidance of Ray McHale 1993/94 proved to be another exceptional season with the First Division title being won and along with it promotion to the Premier Division.

A greater feat was to reach the semi-finals of the FA Challenge Trophy against Runcorn (then a Conference side), when a stoppage time goal in extra-time of the second leg cruelly robbed the club of a third Wembley appearance in four years.

Consolation was gained by becoming the first First Division side to lift the NPL President's Cup, defeating Leek Town over two legs.

Elevation to the Premier Division saw the club gain a record breaking 93 points third position in its first campaign, as well as reaching the First Round Proper of the FA Cup again where, in a home tie against Carlisle United, played at Bradford City's Valley Parade, Vinnie Brockie scored Guiseley's goal in front of a record home club attendance of 6.548.

The latter half of the 1990s had been something of an anti-climax with just the West Riding County Cup being won in 1996 and two NPL President's Cup final defeats in 1996 and 1998.

Following the appointment of former Leeds United striker Bobby Davison as player/manager during the second half of the 1997/98 season a fresh impetus was given to the side as a number of the club's promising young reserve side players were blooded into the squad.

A very creditable third place in the Premier Division of the UniBond League was achieved at the end of the 1998/99 season as well as reaching the final of the League Challenge Cup for the first time

Sadly fortunes took an unexpected turn for the worse the following season with relegation being suffered for the first time in the club's NPL membership which resulted in Davison being replaced by his assistant Neil Parsley.

In 2002/03 an excellent FA Cup run was enjoyed, when, despite languishing at the foot of the table, a fourth appearance in the First Round Proper of the competition was achieved with a visit to Second Division Luton Town. Although suffering a 4-0 defeat the cup run boosted the club's finances as well as providing some memorable matches, notably the 3-2 re-play victory at Tamworth.

Season 2004-05 saw the club back in the Premier Division as a result of the re-structuring of non-league football and saw the club gain its first piece of silverware of the new millenium with the West Riding County Cup being won.

During November 2006 former Bradford City boss Terry Dolan came in as manager and the UniBond League Chairman's Cup was won.

The appointment of Steve Kittrick saw a succession of promotion near misses but the highlight in 2008-2009 was success for the first time in the UniBond Challenge Cup with a 3-2 extra-time victory over Ilkeston Town. The goal of promotion again being missed with a Playoff sem-final defeat at Nantwich.

The club's Centenary season saw massive ground developments with new seated stand, lights and terracing installed.

On the pitch a heart-stopping last few weeks finally saw promotion achieved as champions on the final day.

The first ever Conference North Season proved to be one of the most successful in the club's history with success in the FA Cup where the First Round was once again reached, the FA Trophy, where only a 1-0 defeat by Luton Town prevented a sem-final place and in the league where eventual heartbreak occurred in the last seconds of the Promotion Final play-off at a packed AFC Telford United.

Guiseley were 2-1 up with ten minutes to go and

lost 3-2 with the winner coming for Telford in the third minute of added time.

The West Riding County Cup was lifted again to provide some solace.

Season 2011- 2012 was another successful season with the team finishing as runners-up in the Conference North (its highest ever league position) followed by another Play-Off defeat.

The West Riding County Cup was retained, a second seated stand built, and further ground development took place

Season 2012- 2013 once again saw the club finish as runners-up, and once again heart ache in the Play-Offs, another appearance in the FA Cup First Round, losing to Barrow after a re-play.

The sequence continued in 2013- 2014 where, after a change of manager was implemented and the appointment of centre-back Mark Bower was made, there was a storming run to the Play-Offs. A comfortable semi-final win was followed by another heartbreaking extra-time defeat at Altrincham in the final in front of over 4.600 fans.

Promotion to the Vanarama Conference National Division was finally achieved in 2014 -2015 when, after a fifth place finish, wins in both legs of the semi-finals against AFC Fylde saw the Llons reach the final against Chorley FC.

The omens were poor after a nightmare trip to Lancashire, a late arrival, sickness in the team and an early 2-0 deficit.

However, an astonishing turnaround in the second-half saw the Lions triumph 3-2.

Their first season in the National League saw them avoid the four relegation positions right up until the final two weeks of the season. However a late slump saw them in trouble and only a last day victory over Torquay and defeat for neighbours FC Halifax Town saw Town relegated and Guiseley retain their National League status.

Season 2016-17 started off badly for Guiseley with five successive defeats and so the Board decided to dispense with the services of manager Mark Bower and his assistant Danny Boshell.

Centre-back Adam Lockwood, the former Doncaster Rovers, Yeovil and Oldham Athletic player stepped in as caretaker manager, a move later made permanent.

He then recruited former Doncaster Rovers manager Dave Penney as his assistant. This pair managed to avoid relegation in 2016-17 but a poor start to the 2017-18 campaign saw then replaced in September by former Barrow and Mansfield manager Paul Cox.

Cox persuaded the club to go full time and brought in 18 new players to add to the 24 already with the club.

Suffice to say things did not work out, Cox was sacked in February and former Republic of Ireland centre-back Sean St Ledger moved up from playing to take the reins of a side already doomed to relegation.

What the Guiseley fans will be forever grateful to St Ledger for was the fact that he gave them back their club by bringing a feel-good factor back and re-uniting the players with the supporters.

The season's gloom was lightened by the success of its Academy team under the management of

Dave Currie and the work of its award-winning Community Foundation.

The Board appointed Guiseley's first ever joint manager team for the start of the 2018-19 season when they installed former Solihull and Chester manager Marcus Bignot and former Alfreton Town manager Russ O'Neill, with former England C striker Paul Clayton as their assistant.

They had a tough first season in the league as much of their time was spent trying to move on Cox's highly paid players who were on long contracts.

The new management team endeared themselves to the fans with their all-out efforts for the club.

The FA Cup provided some light relief, joyous moments and much needed funds for the club.

A 4-0 win at Staveley MW, which included a hattrick for Kingsley James, was followed by a trip to Cleethorpes and after a 2-2 draw Guiseley went through 2-1 at home to meet Cambridge United in the First Round Proper on Remembrance Sunday. In front of 1,097 people Guiseley performed magnificently and won 4-1.

This brought a second successive appearance in the Second Round with Joey Barton bringing his Fleetwood Town side to Nethermoor in front of the TV cameras.

Guiseley were unlucky to lose out 2-1 in front of a crowd of 2,324 with Alex Purver netting their goal.

The end of the 2018-19 season saw a big clear out at the club and an influx of young and hungry players came in, some from Guiseley's own very successful Academy.

The squad lined up with nine teenagers in it and 17 of the 22 players under 23 as Bignot and O'Neill banked on youth with a sprinkling of experienced players.

The 2019/20 season bought with it unprecedented challenges in the present era as it was cut short just as The Lions were pouncing on a play off spot, little did anyone know that fans would miss out from football from March 2020 until August 2021 because of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The 2020/21 season never really got going and was again cut short in January 2021 after many interruptions because of Covid-19 rules and regulations around isolation periods for affected clubs and no fans were permitted to attend games.

The academy did provide a bright spark though as they knocked out Bolton Wanderers on their own turf in the FA Youth Cup with a 2-1 extra time victory, Lewis Hey struck the equaliser before Ethan Hudson-Parker's stunner sealed an impressive victory. The Young Lionswere rewarded with a trip to Cambridge United which came after a ten day Covid-19 isolation period which meant training was not permitted, they were knocked out by the EFL League 2 side.

The 2021/22 campaign was another season of struggle for The Lions who continued to face impacts from the Covid-19 pandemic. Marcus Bignot and Russ O'Neill led the side to an Emirates FA Cup first round appearance at AFC Wimbledon in November but after defeat there the league form began to falter. The management duo were placed on gardening leave in April with former boss Steve Kittrick given seven games to save The Lions' place in the Vanarama National League North.

Despite two victories in the run-in it wasn't enough as two late goals from Alfreton on the final day of the season saw GAFC return to the Pitching In Northern Premier League Premier Division for the first time in 12 years.

The academy enjoyed another successful FA Youth Cup run though including a home win over League Two side Rochdale. Scunthorpe United denied Dave Currie's side a chance of a match against Manchester United at Old Trafford in the third round, The Iron recorded a 1-0 win.

In the close season former defender and current academy coach Danny Ellis was appointed as the clubs new manager. The centre back signed on a player manager basis and appointed former Lions midfielder Danny Forrest as his assistant. Ellis could add to his 473 appearances for the club.

The campaign didn't go as planned for Ellis and the legendary defender was replaced as manager in November by Paul Phillips, Forrest also left the club following a one match stay as Interim Manager.

Phillips enjoyed a good start to his Lions career before injuries took their toll and his side slipped away from the play off positions and go into the 2023/24 campaign looking to mount a promotion charge.

MANAGEMENT TEAM

PAUL PHILLIPS - MANAGER - Paul Phillips was appointed as the manager on 30th November 2022 following his departure from Matlock Town in September. Phillips is vastly experienced both as a player and manager, most recently leading both Matlock Town and Buxton to the playoffs. Paul also had success at Ashton United, leading them to playoffs finishes for three consecutive seasons between 2013/14 and 2015/16. The former goalkeeper racked up over 700 appearances in non league for Buxton, Droylsden, Stalybridge, Marine & Ashton United. His playing career started with Droylsden Juniors before a move to Manchester United at the age of 10, he spent six years with the Premier League side before forging a career in non league in the north west. He has also managed Glossop North End and Stalybridge Celtic.

GOALKEEPERS BRAD WADE

Goalkeeper – Back for his fourth spell with the club Brad Wade came through Rochdale's academy and enjoyed three loan spells with the Lions during his years with Dale. After leaving the Spotland based side Wade went on to play for Southport and Hereford.

HAGIE DAMBA

Goalkeeper – Young shot stopper who came through the academy at the club, Hagie has provided cover for the last three campaigns. He made his first league start for the club against Liversedge in April 2023 and kept a clean sheet. To boost his experience of senior men's football Damba is currently on a dual registration deal with Thackley.

DEFENDERS JAMEEL IBLE

Centre Back – Jameel returned to Nethermoor in the summer for his second spell with the club. Whilst away from Nethermoor the defender played for Stockport County, Salford City, Frickley Athletic, Scarborough, Pontefract Collieries and Whitby Town. Jameel represented St Kitts and Nevis in the summer at the Gold Cup coming up against USA, Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago.

COURTNEY MEPPEN-WALTERS

Centre back – Centre back Courtney Meppen-Walters has played for a host of clubs in the Manchester area including Stockport County and Ashton United after coming through Man City's academy. The 28 year-old has also played for Carlisle United, Glossop North End, AFC Telford United and Chorley. He spent last season on loan from Radcliffe before making his move permanent in the summer.



JOSH ASHMAN

Centre back – Ashman joined the Lions in the summer after impressing on trial. It is the centre back's first foray into men's senior football having come through Sheffield Wednesday's academy.

REECE KENDALL

Left back – Another in his second spell with the club Kendall was reunited with Paull Phillips in the summer with the pair previously working together at Matlock Town. Kendall has also played for Spennymoor Town, Brighouse Town and Silsden. He received an England C call up in the 21/22 season, the only player from the NPL to do so.

AIDEN WALKER

Left back – The former Mansfield Town defender can play in a number of positions including left back, centre back, right back and centre midfield. Whilst with the Stags Walker had loan spells with Leek Town, Grantham Town and Coalville before going on to play for Brighouse Town.

OLLIE BROWN

Right back - Ollie came through the Lions' prestigious academy and was the captain of the U18 side which beat Bolton Wanderers in the FA Youth Cup and also captained the academy side during his time with the Young Lions. Brown became a first team regular in the 2021/22 campaign before moving to Alfreton Town where he enjoyed a loan spell with Atherton Collieries, the academy graduate then returned to Nethermoor in the summer for his second spell with the club.

MIDFIELDERS PRINCE EKPOLO

Central Midfielder - Prince Ekpolo's arrival at Guiseley from Bet Victor side Glossop North End was confirmed towards the end of the 2019/20 season. The Nigerian became a popular figure with the fans during his first three season stay with the club. Ekpolo spent the 22/23 season at AFC Telford United but returned in the summer for his second spell with the Lions.

LEIGH WHELAN

Central Midfielder – Irish born Leigh made the move to England to play for Chesterfield's academy in 2020. Whelan then went on to play for Matlock Town, Sheffield FC and Stocksbridge Park Steels as well as representing Cabinteely FC and Shelbourne in his homeland.

LIAM TONGUE (CLUB CAPTAIN)

Central Midfielder – Another to be in his second spell with the club Tongue arrived in the summer and was named the Lions' new captain. The midfielder moved from Hyde United to the Lions and away from the playing side has experience in academies with Man City, Burnley, Sheffield United, Liverpool and Oldham.

JACK DYCHE

Central Midfielder/Utility Player – Dyche rejoined the Lions from Gainsborough in the summer, the former Scunthorpe United and Leeds United man can play in a number of positions including midfield, defence or up front. Jack had his first spell with the club during the 18/19 season and went on to play for Boston United, Bradford (Park Avenue), Farsley Celtic, Hyde United, Ossett United and Curzon Ashton.

BAILEY CONWAY

Central Midfielder – The highly rated former Sheffield United youngster made the switch to Nethermoor from Gainsborough in the summer. Conway has also played for Alfreton Town and Rossington Main after coming through the Blades' academy.

JOE STACEY

Winger – Stacey arrived in the summer after impressing on trial. The former Grantham man can play anywhere on the left or right hand side of the pitch and came through Rotherham United's academy before moving to Virginia USA for a four and a half year university scholarship.

CALLUM CHIPPENDALE

Attacking Midfielder – Chippendale made the perfect start to life at Guiseley scoring from the penalty spot on his debut in a 3-1 win at Belper Town last season. The midfielder who likes to score goals joined from Matlock Town and has plenty of experience at the level and above having previously played for Bradford (Park Avenue), Boston United, Gainsborough Trinity, Glossop North End, Shaw Lane and Buxton.

LEWIS WHITHAM

Winger - Lewis joined the club for an undisclosed fee from Alfreton Town last season and scored on his debut. The explosive winger signed for Alfreton after a short stay with Liversidge, his first taste of senior football came with Stocksbridge Park Steels. The explosive winger is expected to miss most of the campaign after suffering a torn ACL, MCL and meniscus in his left knee back in March.

MIGUEL VALSAU

Winger - Academy product Valsau Valsau joined the Young Lions in 2019 after being scouted by boss Dave Currie at the UK Football Trials. Miguel has previously played his football in his homeland and the Netherlands, when he moved to England he signed for Sheffield United's development squad alongside the academy.

FORWARDS TOM DENTON

Striker – Standing at 6ft 7ins Denton adds some height to the Lions' front line after signing from Alfreton Town in the summer. The tall striker has racked up plenty of experience across his long career for clubs such as Chesterfield, FC Halifax Town, Huddersfield Town, Wakefield, North Ferriby United and Worksop Town.

KALLAN MURPHY

Striker – Born in Ireland Murphy made the trip over to England in 2020 to play for Chesterfield's academy. Murphy played under Paul Phillips at Matlock Town earlier on in the 2021/22 season before making the switch to Nethermoor.

TOM PRATT

Forward – Pratt joined Guiseley in the summer after a six year stay at Hyde United where he was a firm fans favourite. Pratt made his professional debut for Bury in 2013 before joining Ashton United and then signing for Trafford.

LAURENCE SORHAINDO

Striker – Another summer recruit Sorhaindo was signed by Paul Phillips from Brighouse Town. Laurence came through Bradford City's academy before signing for Silsden.

GABRIEL JOHNSON

Forward – Gabriel returned for his second spell with the Lions in the summer. Johnson had spells as a youngster with Manchester United U-14s and Leeds United U-17s before his season with the Academy at Sheffield United. He has also played for Hallam FC, Sheffield FC and Doncaster Rovers.

EDWIN ESSEL

Striker – On loan from Grimsby Town. Edwin signed on a one month loan deal from the League 2 Mariners in August after temporary spells away from Town with Grimsby Borough and Cleethorpes Town last season.

ORGIVE the self-indulgence, but some of my best memories of this job will be covering the FA Cup — more specifically, the FA Cup shocks.

For every long trip to Huddersfield Town — where they stuck two past Dover Athletic inside the opening eight minutes before playing out a 2-0 win — there's been an enjoyable drive back from Burnley or Torquay.

Lincoln City's run of 2016-17 stands out the most, largely because I was fortunate enough to be there for most of the ride.

Ipswich Town away in early January brought a 2-2 draw for the Imps but who could predict what would come with a journey that catapulted the club and its then managers — Danny and assistant Nicky Cowley — into another stratosphere.

Ipswich were finished off in the third round replay
— I watched on TV — before Brighton & Hove
Albion were turned over in the fourth round.

Out of the hat came Burnley where Sean Raggett's late goal won an incredible tie. Sitting in the press room after I felt I had to check over and over again that Lincoln City had reached the quarter-finals before writing into the match report.

Before we knew it, we were at Danny Cowley's house with the FA Cup for a special pre-Arsenal feature.

The Premier League Gunners were next but Arsene Wenger's side were in no mood to be part of any more history, seeing off the Imps 5-0 — not that the 10,000 travelling supporters ever lost their voice.

When Crawley Town went to Manchester United in 2011 it was a much closer encounter, striker Richard Brodie just inches away from a late equaliser only for the woodwork to intervene.

My in-person north-west record is pretty good.

Then I was there when Salford City beat Notts County 2-0 on a Friday night in November 2015 .The next day legendary FA Cup giant killers Altrincham dumped out League One Barnsley 1-0, immediately justifying The NLP's hotel bill for my overnight stay!

But it hasn't just been the upsets or the nearmisses. A privilege of the job is being able to tell the stories in the build-up or be at a club when it's all eyes on them. Paulton Rovers may have been turned over by Norwich City, but the buzz around the club through the week was heightened even more on match day as FA Cup fever swept through the small village.

We're inching closer to this season's FA Cup first round proper with the fourth round qualifying games just around the corner.

The exciting thing about the FA Cup is this year's stories are just waiting to be written. Experiencing them in person is definitely a job perk!
