oday sees the FA Cup come to the Northolme as Matlock Town are the visitors in what could be a excellent cup tie as Neal Bishop's Holy Blues look to really kick start their season.

Looking at the league table, it hasn't been the greatest of starts for Gainsborough, but it's still early days and a good cup run can certainly turn the form table upside down.

My first ever visit to this wonderful ground was in the FA Cup when Gainsborough Trinity hosted Barnet in the first round back on 11th November 2006, Infront of 1.914 fans. I had never experienced non league football back then and when a couple of my friends asked if I fancied coming along, I jumped at the chance and my first love of non league was born.

The Holy Blues lost the game that day 3-1 with two late Tresor Kandol goals which helped the football league Bees knock out Conference North Gainsborough.

I have many personal memories of the FA Cup, ranging from Lincoln City beating Ipswich with a last minute winner on my birthday, to Boston United beating Carlshalton 4-1 and my commentary appearing on Match Of The Day. With Gainsborough more recently I was here for the 8-2 demolition of Chasetown in a replay and who can forget the results at Spennymoor and Harrogate on their way to round one under the guidance of Dave Frecklington.

A lot of people say the magic of the FA Cup has gone and let's be honest, it has, especially in later

rounds, when you see Premier League sides entering the competition, resting players, moaning about fixture schedules and that's why we also have lost the joy of replays further on. We also have the semi finals



being at Wembley aswell as some finals kicking off at teatime.

However it is in the early rounds, the preliminary rounds up to Round 2 that sees the magic continue, sees excitement, replays, shocks, passion and teams having a really good go at the competition. Teams who all dream of a run to Round 1, a chance to play a big Football League club, a chance to be on tele, a chance to make so much money it can set a team up for life, ahhh if only

And so that brings us back to Gainsborough Trinity v Matlock Town, a tie that I doubt either side were happy with when the draw was made. The positive is that it's a fairly local game and therefore we should hope for a good crowd and who knows if this is the start of something special for either the Holy Blues or the Gladiators!

I am at the game today, my visits for one reason or another are quite limited this season, but I have to admit I'm quite excited so come and say hello!

ood afternoon everyone and welcome to the Northolme for this afternoon's 1st Qualifying round of the FA Cup against Matlock Town.


Both clubs will be wanting to progress and hoping to reach the Magical 1st round proper on Saturday 4th November where the Football League clubs enter the competition and the FA prize money reaches £41,000 for the 1st round winners.

Prize money for today's game is £2,250 for the winners, but the glory of winning the game is what it's all about.

Gainsborough and Matlock have played each other three times previously in the FA cup, with the Derbyshire club yet to lose.

The first time the clubs met was on 5th October 1974 in the 2nd Qualifying round. Matlock were drawn at home in Causeway Lane and won 2-1, Monty Brown scoring Trinity's consolation goal.

The next time the two clubs were drawn together came in 1987, and again Matlock were favoured with a home draw.

Unfortunately, the Trinity forwards left their scoring boots in the dressing room and Matlock ran out comfortable winners by 3-0. Trinity team: Kaye, Waller, Gaffney, Powell, Oates, Lodge, Simpson, Sykes, Dickinson, Watkin and Tilley.

Approximately 50 miles separate the Towns of Gainsborough and Matlock so not really surprising to see so many players representing both clubs over the seasons gone by.

Perhaps we will see Jonno Margetts in the Matlock colours today? And Alex Byrne who played here last season are the most recent.

Goalkeepers Adam Sollitt and Phil Barnes have both kept goal for the Blues and the Gladiators.

Popular Trinity Manager Ernie Moss is easily remembered as Managing both clubs, and Jamie Yates and Ross Hannah both fans favourites at each club.

Perhaps one of the most surprising players to switch clubs was James Lukic. The central defender amassed a massive 672 games

for Matlock, but switched to the Northolme in an unlikely move in 2008, making just the one FA cup appearance in Trinity colours at Halesowen Town.

Players who can name representing Trinity, Matlock and Lincoln City on their CV are John Schofield, Terry Hawkridge and Greg Tempest.

Other names that will be remembered by the Trinity supporters include, Lew McMahon, Ryan Mallon and Liam Needham.

With Trinity and Matlock both evenly placed in the Premier division a tight game should be expected, and hopefully home advantage will see the Blues through.

MATLOCK TOWN CLUB HISTORY

Matlock Town sprung to prominence as one of the leading non league clubs in the country during the 1970's..

They joined the NPL in 1969/70 and their early years in the competition saw them struggle towards the bottom of the league.

Earlier they had won the Central Alliance Division North Champions in 1959/60 and 1960/61, which saw them enter the Midland Counties League which they won in their debut season. Additionally in 1959/60 they reached the FA Cup First Round for the first time, losing 1-0 at home to Crook Town after a replay.

When they won the Midland Counties League for the second time in 1968/69 they were invited to join the NPL and they have now been members of the league for 51 seasons.

Matlock won the FA Trophy at Wembley in April 1975, beating Scarborough 4-0, then a record winning margin for the final and the only time when three brothers have played for the same club in a Wembley final as Tom, Mick and Nick Fenoughty played leading roles.

Peter Swan had taken over as manager at the start of the season bringing about a fantastic attacking style to Matlock's play. Success had come earlier in the 1974/75 campaign as Matlock progressed to the First Round of the FA Cup, losing 4-1 at home to eventual Third Division champions Blackburn Rovers in front of over 5,000 spectators. Two days after their Wembley win they captured the Derbyshire Senior Cup for the first time with a 6-1 home win against Glossop and an aggregate margin of 9-3.

Tom Fenoughty replaced Swan as manager at the start of the 1976/77 season which saw Matlock reach the FA Cup Third Round for the one and only time. In Round Two Matlock beat eventual Third Division champions Mansfield Town 5-2 on their own ground, the Stags only home defeat of the campaign. Carlisle beat them in the next round and drew Liverpool away in Round Four! The NPL title narrowly eluded them as the finished in third spot behind champions Boston United and Northwich Victoria but silverware came their way with an aggregate win over New Mills in the Derbyshire Senior Cup Final.

In 1977/78 Matlock won the NPL Cup by beating Boston United 3-0 in the final at Maine Road, Manchester to enable them to qualify for the Anglo-Italian tournament in 1979. They finished as English runners up to Sutton United following 2-1 defeats to both Chieti and Pisa in Italy but beating Juniorcasale and Cremonese 2-0 at home.

Matlock's best league campaign to date was in 1983/84 when they finished runners-up to Barrow. Their last FA

Cup 1st Round appearance was in 1989/90 when they were beaten 4-1 at Scunthorpe United.

They lost their Premier Division status at the end of the 1995/96 campaign and did not return to the top flight until they finished second to Hyde United in the NPL First Division in 2003/04. In the following season they won the NPL Cup after beating Whitby Town in a two legged final.

Matlock's league form was been patchy with a number of bottom half finishes, their best being a 5th placed finish in 2006/07 when they lost in the play-off semi final after extra time at Witton Albion. Witton proved to be an unlucky ground for them in that season as Fleetwood Town beat them 1-0 to lift the NPL Cup.

Their most recent honours have been in the Derbyshire Senior Cup which they won in 2014/15 and 2016/17, on both occasions beating Gresley in the final at Chesterfield 7-0 and 5-0 respectively. They have been giant killers in the FA Trophy though, beating Mansfield Town in 2012/13, Halifax and Solihull Moors in 2016/17 and Chorley in 2019/20..

Former Ashton United goalkeeper and manager Paul Phillips was appointed as team manager in January 2020. Matlock's league position considerably improved.. The early ending of the 2019/20 campaign due to Covid saw Matlock escape from a relegation battle and although the following season was also terminated early, the signs were there of a much better Matlock side. In 2021/22 they led the table for a good part of the campaign before finishing fourth, losing away at Scarborough Athletic in a play off semi final.

Paul Phillips departed the club in September 2022. Former Boston United manager Craig Elliott was named as his replacement only to leave to take the vacant managerial position at Buxton in December 2022. Former Stoke City and Aston Villa striker Martin Carruthers became Matlock's third manager of the season and made an excellent start to his time at the club by steering the club to a fifth placed final position and qualify for the play-offs for the second successive season..

They have one of the most picturesque grounds in the country and with a new stand and Social Club up and running since 2011, there are some top class facilities on the ground.

Finally, why are Matlock nicknamed the Gladiators? A lot of people ask the question. It's because one time pa announcer Jim Whitworth played the Entry of the Gladiators music as Matlock ran out on to the pitch, and it stayed, hence Matlock being known throughout the country as The Gladiators.

MATLOCK TOWN PLAYER PROFILES

MARTIN CARRUTHERS (MANAGER)

Martin was appointed in December 2022 following the departure of Craig Elliott to Buxton. A former Football League striker he made 503 appearances scoring 133 goals including playing top flight football at Aston Villa. He made 121 appearances for Stoke City in the First Division (now Championship) between 1993 and 1997, the rest of his career being in Leagues One and Two. In non-league he started out at Grantham town before moving to Ilkeston where he would become player-coach. He had a very successful six years at Basford United, guiding them from the East Midlands League to the NPL Premier Division. After a short spell managing Quorn he was back at Ilkeston and last season he led them to the NPL Midlands Division title. He left Ilkeston by mutual consent in September 2022 and had a successful first few months at Matlock by leading them to a 5th placed finish and qualify for the NPL Premier Division play offs..

WAYNE HALLCRO (ASSISTANT MANAGER)

Wayne joined Matlock as assistant to Martin Carruthers in December 2022. He has held joint or assistant manager positions at a number of East Midlands clubs including Ilkeston Town, Belper Town ,Grantham Town and Stamford.

ANDY HENSON (SPORTS THERAPIST)

Andy joined Matlock in February 2023 from Guiseley in a move which suited him being closer to his Chesterfield home. He began his physio career with Chesterfield working with their first team for a year. He had two years at Silsden before being Head Physio at the academies of both Port Vale and Doncaster Rovers and has also worked with GB Medics at their international tournaments.. Andy has degrees in both Sports Rehabilitation and Physiotherapy and works as a First Contact Physio within a GP Practice.

SAUL DEENEY (GOALKEEPER)

Vastly experienced Saul joined Matlock from Ilkeston Town in January 2023. He has Football League experience at Notts County, Hull City, Burton Albion and Derby County. Probably his finest game was against Manchester United in an F A Cup 3rd Round tie in January 2006 when he kept a clean sheet against Alex Ferguson's Manchester United to earn a 0-0 draw for Burton Albion. More recently he has been with Basford United, Coalville Town and Ilkeston Town.

MYLES WRIGHT (GOALKEEPER)

26 years old Myles is from Matlock and made his debut for them in a home game with Worksop Town as a 17 year old. Since then he has been with Chesterfield, Buxton and Belper Town coming to Matlock for a second time during the summer of 2023.

JAMIE SHARMAN (DEFENDER)

Jamie was Chesterfield's Academy Player of the Year in 2018/19 before graduating to the first team. He was loaned out to Dover Athletic, Kidderminster Harriers and Blyth Spartans before Chesterfield released him during the summer of 2021. He has become one of the most popular players at Matlock and last season he was recognised twice at the club's Awards Night, winning the Young Player Of The Year and the Matlock Fans Forum Player Of The Season.

IOAN EVANS (DEFENDER)

24 years old Ioan joined Matlock from Stalybridge Celtic in September 2021 having been an ever present in the Celtic defence during the opening fixtures of the new season, scoring three goals. He began his career at the Newport County Academy and played for both the Welsh under 17 and under 19 teams. He moved to Sheffield United and had a loan spell at Boston United before being released by the Blades. He joined Gainsborough Trinity and then moved to Tadcaster Albion before switching to Stalybridge. Dangerous in both boxes standing at six foot plus and highly experienced in the National League North, Ioan has been consistent and has shown what an important signing he was for the club, Last season he was voted as Players Player of the Season.

ROBBIE McNICHOLAS (DEFENDER)

Robbie was signed from Loughborough Dynamo in February 2023. He is well known to manager Martin Carruthers having graduated from the academy to the first team at Basford United when Carruthers was first team manager at Greenwich Avenue. Equally comfortable as either a full back or right wing back, Robbie has also played for Newark and Carlton Town.

MATLOCK TOWN PLAYER PROFILES

JOE WEST (DEFENDER)

23 years old attacking left back Joe was signed from Gainsborough Trinity in the summer of 2023. He enjoyed a fine season with Trinity helping them to a play off berth. Starting out at Sheffield Wednesday, Joe moved on to Farsley Celtic and Frickley and he should provide the left footed balance Matlock missed in their back line last season.

GEORGE WILKINSON (DEFENDER)

George has signed on loan from Chesterfield having been with the Spireites since under 9 level. He made his first appearance in the first team against Coalville Town in the FA Trophy last season, scoring the Chesterfield goal in a 3-1 loss. He later went on loan to Coalville.

MASON BRIDDEN (DEFENDER)

18 years old Mason has been at both Chesterfield and Scunthorpe academies as well as having a spell at Worksop Town. He is from Matlock's under 21 squad and has signed first team forms in August 2023, getting valuable match experience at Retford FC in the NCEL First Division.

ANDREW WRIGHT (MIDFIELD)

Andrew is no stranger to Matlock now in his third spell with the Gladiators. He first featured for Matlock on loan from Lincoln City in the 2016/17 campaign. His second spell came in 2018/19 after he had scored 17 times for Coalville Town but his contract was terminated a few weeks into the season and he joined Mickleover. Last season he was at Gainsborough Trinity where he was club captain in a team which reached the NPL Premier Division play-offs. Andrew also had success with Grantham Town during the 2017/18 campaign as the Gingerbreads were beaten NPL Premier Division play off finalists.

KEMY AUGUSTIEN (MIDFIELD)

Kemy is a vastly experienced midfielder born in Holland but a Curocaoan international. He had two years with Willem11 before joining AZ Alkamaar. He arrived in Britain to join Swansea City after a loan spell with Birmingham City while he was in Holland. He made his Premiership debut for Swansea against Manchester City and would play 39 times for the Swans. After a loan spell at Crystal Palace he made thirteen appearances in a two years stint at Brighton and Hove Albion. His non league career has seen him at a number of clubs, most notably at Mickleover for whom

he played 41 games between 2020 and 2022. Last season he was with Kettering Town and Hednesford Town. Internationally he has chalked up 19 games for the Netherlands under 19's 20's and 21's and he is approaching 20 caps for Curocaoa,



OLIVER CLARK (MIDFIELD)

Oliver joined Matlock from Basford United in the summer of 2023. His time at Basford was spoilt by a significant knee injury from which he has now fully recovered. Described as aggressive and tenacious by manager Martin Carruthers, Oliver to joining Basford

CONNOR DIMAIO (MIDFIELD)

Connor signed for Matlock in February 2023 from National League North Curzon Ashton. Chesterfield born, he was at the Sheffield United Academy before graduating to their first team making three first team appearances during 2013/14. He then joined Chesterfield and after 44 games for his hometown club, he moved to Stockport County making 35 appearances and scoring three goals. In August 2020 Connor signed for Boston United before joining Curzon Ashton after a second loan spell with the Nash. He has also represented the Republic of Ireland at under 16, 17, 19 and 21 levels. Unfortunately within a month of joining Matlock, he collapsed to the turf during a home game with Ashton United and his worst fears were realised as he had to undergo surgery on a ruptured anterior cruciate ligament and strained medial and lateral ligaments, and. Connor is expected to miss much of the season.

ARCHIE WHITE (MIDFIELD)

Archie is a youngster on loan from Chesterfield who had been showing impressive form for Staveley Miners Welfare prior to joining Matlock.. His father Rockie was a legend in the Matlock midfield in the early to mid 2000's playing a starring role when Matlock beat Whitby to win the NPL Cup in 2005.

SAM HOOPER (MIDFIELD)

Described as a buzzing central midfielder, Sam joined Matlock on loan from Chesterfield in March 2023 after also impressing for Staveley Miners Welfare. His one first team appearance to date for the Spireites was in an FA Trophy defeat by Coalville Town in December 2022.

JOHN JOHNSTON (WINGER)

John signed at Matlock in October 2022 from Guiseley as part of a deal which saw Callum Chippendale move in the opposite direction. A direct winger who loves to run at opponents, John has extensive National League North experience, winning titles with Salford City and Altrincham as well as playing at Chester, Alfreton Town and Guiseley. NPL experience has been with Kidsgrove Athletic.

NATHANIEL CROFTS (WINGER)

Nathaniel joined Matlock in the summer of 2023 after being at Guiseley. The Sheffield born winger can play on either flank and during a four year spell in America he gained a BA degree in African and American studies. As a youngster he had spells at Barnsley and Sheffield Wednesday before settling in at Sheffield United, signing a professional contract at age 17 and playing for both the u18 and u 21 sides. When the Blades released him, he went to America and undertook a scholarship at the University of Virginia but he returned to the UK when Covid struck and signed for Stocksbridge Park Steels before his move to Guiseley.

BEN HENDERSON (WINGER)

Ben joined Matlock from Eastwood Community FC during the 2022/23 campaign and impressed manager Martin Carruthers sufficiently during the pre season campaign to be offered the opportunity of challenging for a regular first team place. He gas also been with Matlock's under 21 side.

ALEXANDER DUHAMEAU (FORWARD)

Alexander can operate as either a winger or a striker and has been signed on loan from Chesterfield where he made his full first team debut in the Isuzu FA Trophy defeat to Coalville Town. His academy coach at Chesterfield Neil Cluxton rates him very highly and describes him as hard working and a player with great desire..

KARL DEMIDH (FORWARD)

Karl has been a prolific goalscorer on the East Midlands non league scene for a number of years listing Belper Town, Mickleover, Grantham Town, Sheffield, Shepshed Dynamo and Loughborough Dynamo amongst his clubs. A football coach at Loughborough University, Karl joined Matlock from United Counties League Quorn in January 2023 having hit 21 goals for them last season.

HARRY WAKEFIELD (FORWARD)

23 years old Harry joined Matlock from Leicester based Anstey Nomads in February 2023 after scoring fourteen goals for them last season. He is well known to manager Martin Carruthers after being with him at Basford United, graduating from the academy to the first team there. Standing at 6'2" he has also been at Nuneaton Borough, Ilkeston and Shepshed Dynamo.

REECE STYCHE (FORWARD)

Reece is an experienced international striker who plays for Gibraltar. He joined Matlock from Stourbridge in March 2023. He started out at Hednesford Town and between 2006 and 2009 he played for a number of Midland based clubs before in 2010 having a spell in the National League with Forest Green Rovers coring 35 goals in 107 matches. In 2014 he moved to Kidderminster Harriers where he scored six times in 36 games and after some loan moves he joined Macclesfield Town. A move to Gateshead followed but then he played at Tamworth, Darlington and Alfreton Town where he averaged a goal in every two matches. During the last four years he has also been at Buxton and Hednesford before joining Stourbridge, netting 19 times for the Southern League Premier Central side.

JONATHAN MARGETTS (FORWARD)

Jon joined Matlock for a second spell during the summer after a successful spell at Stamford where he played a prominent part in Stamford winning the NPL Midlands Division title. He was the division's Golden Boot winner netting 33 times in league games and was also named as the divisional player of the season. He started out at Hull City before featuring at Cambridge United, Tranmere Rovers, Lincoln City and Scunthorpe United with loan spells at a number of non league sides. He was with Boston United, Gainsborough Trinity, Frickley and Belper Town prior to being at Stamford. His first spell at Matlock was on loan from Boston United in the latter part of the 2018/19 campaign.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

Barely three weeks into the new season and already the managerial merry-goround is gathering momentum.

We're not even into September yet two National League bosses have lost their jobs – an evergrowing trend which has sadly been set year-onyear, whatever the level.

Friday night's defeat by Southend United spelt the end of the road for Eastleigh boss Lee Bradbury, whose side, despite heavy investment and much strengthening over the summer, had failed to hit the ground running.

And, a little over 48 hours later, it was a similar tale for York City's Mikey Morton as a 3-1 home defeat by Rochdale saw him follow the same path through the exit door and into the pool of the unemployed.

Sadly, given the re-structures, growth and ambition of the two football clubs they represented, Bradbury and Morton were sitting ducks. As will their successors be.

Such is the high-octane nature and pressure cooker landscape of the game these days, even in the fifth tier of the English game, not a shred of leniency or empathy is afforded to the man in the hotseat. It's dog eat dog from the very first whistle.
